

My Classic Journey - Pt 6

The owner of the Sunbeam Talbot Alpine upon retiring to Culburra Beach commenced his restoration. As many of you know who have restored cars over the years, he made the first and a costly mistake in the restoration process.

In his haste to start he enthusiastically pulled parts off and stored them in boxes and bags randomly. He did not sort and label them so the problem we ultimately encountered was we were uncertain what they were, and some parts were stored in other locations around his property and were mislaid.

After stripping the car fairly quickly and then arranging for it to be assessed by a local panel beater he then suffered a massive stroke which stopped the restoration dead in the water so to speak.

He decided that the car restoration was really beyond him with his current health situation, and he reluctantly put the car up for sale.

Back in the 1990's there was no internet, EBAY or Facebook/Messenger so each month most car enthusiasts would purchase Unique Cars to see what gems would come up Australia. It was a great way to see cars for sale interstate and a great talking point on car runs as well.

I remember when I saw the advert as I was in discussions with another Alpine for sale which was sitting out in the open over a red soil cutting in the Kingscliff hinterland. Unfortunately, this blue Alpine was slowly but surely rusting away and would blend into the red soil beautifully!

I remember opening the driver's door and looking at the rust holes all through the body, Fred Flintstone would have loved this car. In fact, it was far worse than the Jensen Interceptor I viewed all those years ago in England.

I would have to had taken a second mortgage to restore this vehicle or though re-bodying would have been a better option if I could find a rust-free body. I even spoke to an owner in the USA who had several good bodies but then the Alpine came up in Unique Cars.

The Alpine looked good in the photos the owner sent me, so I took the plunge and did what I have never done before and purchased it without viewing it first.

When the Sunbeam Talbot Alpine arrived in Brisbane the rust in the body was more severe than we thought. It was so severe that instead of fixing the rust in the floor another floor was welded on and later another floor was added. When we sandblasted it off the chassis the returned body looked like Swiss cheese with more rust holes than we could see structural metal.

At this point in time, I just parked it with my body shop to decide after some deliberations what I would do with the vehicle.

After much discussion with my wife and body shop, we decided to face the situation and commence body restoration. This process took almost five years and eventually the body shop lost interest, so I moved it to another restorer who finished the body and paint for us.

The other issue I had to face was the previous owner had moved and some parts that were meant to be with the vehicle were there. If they were Talbot 90 specific that was not an issue as I could source them locally or from England. The Alpine specific parts I needed were the detachable side screens and the Hood front rail and securing clips. I managed to locate the screens from another Alpine owner - the late Bill Ewing in Wynnum North. He owned a sky-blue Alpine which he shipped over to England to participate in historic rallies over there. He also had a great collection of other historic vehicles including a lovely preiwar Aston Martin. After he passed on the Alpine was sold to the Sleeping Beauties owner Wolf Grodd who has undertaken many fantastic restorations on Mercedes Benz locally for owners all around the world.

As well as incurring financial penalties for operating outside of the scheme, you may face serious insurance implications if you are involved in an incident causing damage to your or other vehicles or property, or injury to yourself or others whilst not being compliant with registration requirements due to lapsed membership.



Now, however, it's time to get them ready to go and as usual Australia Day is the first run for many Clubs. It's always amazing to me to see just how much the battery drops over the Xmas break so in readiness for Australia Day I put it on the charger, checked the car's vitals and then started it up just in case it had forgotten what it will be expected to do!!!! 



WEARING OF SEAT BELTS—CLASSIC VEHICLES

The government camera scheme to detect wearing of seatbelts has been clarified by the Transport Main Roads with respect to wearing them whilst in a Classic car built prior to 1969 (when seat-belts were not installed when manufactured). A representative of the TMR has stated that all photos taken are cross-referenced with the vehicle registration details and if the vehicle is prior to 1969 and NO belts were fitted, NO FURTHER ACTION WOULD OCCUR—THE PHOTO WOULD BE DISMISSED.

However, if a photo was inadvertently processed and a summons was issued, contact TMR and they will deal with it in your favour.

- Gearbox rebuilt (all bearings replaced)
- Brakes restored (shoes all replaced)
- Master cylinder replaced
- All brake lines replaced
- Engine rebuilt installed and test run (runs like a dream)
- As body frame is coach built, all wood replaced where necessary
- Some body panels refitted to frame

All original parts are available to complete the restoration. Hundreds of photos of strip down are available for reference, they have been invaluable during the work so far. In addition, there is a workshop manual, original sales documentation and other supporting information.

Car has not been registered since 1977 (last registration sticker from Victoria, is still on the windscreen). I acquired the car in October 2005 and have been working on it, on and off, since then.

I would like to cover what I have spent on the vehicle, not interested in making a profit. I just hope that it goes to someone who is dedicated enough to complete the restoration. Just out of interest the last sale I have tracked the same model sold in U.K. for equivalent of \$A150,000. My asking price to cover costs so far is \$A20,000.
