## Kevin Bowyer - More Bee stories from the early 70's

Kevin and his partners in the bee business travelled long distances to place their hives in different locations to get the best honey. All their spotted gum variety were from a forest north of Batemans Bay. They had a site at Termeil State Forest near the Meroo National Park which was known as "Hat Site".

The "Hat Site" place was known for the cork hat which was nailed to a tree about 15ft up. Kevin is not sure how long it was up there, but that was the landmark for the camp, and it was recorded in their yard book (log book). The yard book was used to record the number of hives and where they were located along with the date and other data. Beekeepers commonly used to wear cork hats.

Unlike the Piliga scrub, boiling the Billy was never easy with spotted gum wood, it did not burn very hot. When returning to the hives that were placed in the Benandarah State Forest, often the hives were damaged by vandals driving into the hive boxes with their bull bars.

On a brighter note, when loading the spotted gum hives Kevin would always hear Lyre Birds calling that were prevalent in the area.

Navigating the Clyde Mountain was always a challenge. It is mostly wet and slippery and the road does not get a lot of sun during the winter months. Kevin was on his way down in his Mercedes truck to a pickup a load of honey just after some rain. He changed down the gears to slow the truck then it started to slip into the rock wall on the side of the highway. This could have been a lot worse, if it had slipped to the right-hand side of the road he could have gone over the edge into a deep gully below. Luckily there was just some minor panel damage and Kevin continued on to collect his hives.

It would take an hour to get up the Clyde from Termeil with a load of honey on the Mercedes and the caravan being towed by a Datsun Homer light truck.

A story for Don Marriott found on the internet -

During World War II, the Willys MB, the famous Jeep, was stored and transported disassembled in wooden boxes for easy handling and quick assembly on the battlefield. This storage method ensured that the vehicles arrived in good condition to tackle different terrains. The Jeep was developed in 1941 by Willys-Overland Motors to meet the needs of the US military. With four-wheel drive and a robust design, the Willys MB and its version produced by Ford, the GPW, have become essential for military transport. After the war, Willys began manufacturing civilian versions, which evolved into the Jeep brand we know today. The name "Jeep" probably comes from the pronunciation of the letters "GP" (General Purpose), used to describe the vehicle. Another theory suggests that the name may have been inspired by the character "Eugene the Jeep" from the Popeye comics. The Jeep remains a symbol of durability and versatility in the off-road vehicle segment.
