

<u>Club Meetings:</u> General Meetings are held at the Boambee Hall at 7.00 pm on the first Thursday of each month except for January when no meeting is normally held.

Club Fees: A joining fee of \$5.00 applies. Annual fees are \$45.00 for a Single Membership, \$50.00 for a

Family Membership, \$15.00 for a Junior Membership and \$10.00 for Associate Membership. Fees are due on 1St January each year for the calendar year. However, as membership of an approved car club is an RMS requirement for Concessional Registration of vehicles, annual fees for members seeking registration of cars in the following year are payable at the Rego Day, normally the third Sunday in November. For members joining the Club after 30 June each year, half annual fees will apply.

For an annual fee of \$15.00 (payable to the Treasurer) a member may arrange to have a printed B/W copy delivered by Australia Post to an address of their choice.

1928 A Model Ford

In the last "Splutter" a photo showing a line of club cars at Taylors Arm in the late 1980's was included and mentioned that only one of the cars shown is still active in the club today. A few sharp-eyed members spotted that the car mentioned was the Editor's chariot of choice, our 1928 Model A Ford Ute. So, I thought I'd tell members a bit more about it, given its long association with our Club - which, of course, turns 50 years old this year!

It is an Australian bodied "Flare side light delivery" that was originally purchased by a Mr Worrell who used it around his farm in the Barradine (NSW) area. Its second owner was Mick O'Neill, a former member of the Club, who acquired the car in the mid-1970s and restored it over the next few years. He used it in rallies and club events until around 1988 when other interests took over and he stored the car in a shipping container until we acquired it. Mick was the publican of the Coramba Hotel and the car was displayed at the pub for a while. Life member Jack Brain rebuilt the motor for this car and he told me it was sold new by his family's business, Brain Motors in Coonabarabran.

In 2007, I heard from club members that it was for sale. I rang Mick, and Alison and I made arrangements to meet him and have a look at the car. A deal was soon done, and we excitedly picked it up the following weekend. I think Mick was pleased that car would be back in use with the club again.

Our car is one of the earlier Model A Fords, it has the red steering wheel (later cars had black steering wheels...the red pigment stains your hands when conditions are wet or humid...as I soon found out!), non-adjustable brake rods, non-adjustable valve lifters and a few other features that were refined on later cars. As an early commercial bodied vehicle, it actually has Model T running boards and rear guards (Ford using up old parts!)

The car took a bit of work to get back on the road after its extended layup, with radiator, wheel bearings, tyres, exhaust and virtually the entire ignition system being replaced. After a year or so back on the road, we noticed it was very sluggish on hills and I discovered a number of burnt out exhaust valves. This, of course, meant a set of new valves — a tricky job as each valve stem had to be ground to the correct clearance. With a new head gasket installed, I got it running just in time for the wedding of some good friends.

The Model A has been a great car for Alison and I. In our earlier years with the club, we used it extensively and have attended numerous rallies in places such as Armidale, Guyra, Tamworth, Hat Head / Kempsey and Forster Tuncurry. After the initial flurry of work, it has proven very reliable, and I don't think I have had to put a spanner on it (apart from routine maintenance) for the last 10 years. I did shout it a new condenser recently. In the last 10 years we have become increasingly involved with veteran cars so the Model A doesn't get as much use as it used to.

The Model A has the fuel tank in the cowl just in front of the dashboard. The fuel gauge comes from the tank directly into the instrument cluster on the dash. One trip to Armidale for a rally we filled up with fuel at Ebor and every time we went up a hill we could smell petrol strongly. Soon we had a small waterfall of petrol leaking through the dash! This is how we discovered the gasket behind the gauge was perished and leaking...One spark and we (and the car) would have been history! We continued to drive with a rag pressed against the fuel gauge until the level dropped in the tank and the leak stopped. We only filled the tank to halfway after that!

On one of our early club runs in the A, we were heading to Fred & Dot Arnolds place in Bonville for afternoon tea on a very hot day. Suddenly, there was a "clang, clang, clang" and I managed to pull over and switch off before a broken fan blade came away from the entire hub and bored a hole through something expensive. Slipping the fan belt off we nursed the car to Freds. We took the fan off and Keith Winkler and Bob Dixon eyed off Fred's welder. "You got any welding rods, Fred?" they asked... "No...just use a bit of fencing wire" was the reply. So, in the full

heat of the afternoon, Keith & Bob welded up the fan blade with wire while Fred (who was in his late 80's and had had to turn in his drivers licence) entertained the gathered members with a bit of circle work in the bottom paddock in his Hudson Wasp! The fan got us home but was quickly replaced with a new one.

As editor of "Coffs Splutter" I hope I have inspired (or at least coerced!) a few of you into putting some words together about your old car for the magazine. I am even happy for you to ring me and I'll take some notes down and work it up into a story. A few photos and... 'voila'...we have an article! Happy motoring!

My owner is asking \$13,990 for me.


