





Who was Siegfried Marcus?

Seigfried was most likely the first to build a "car" which ran on petrol. Whilst most of the records and artifacts were destroyed by the Nazis during WW2, since he was Jewish, there is evidence to suggest that by 1870 he had made a hand cart powered by a petrol engine, petrol being an unwanted fraction from the refining of crude oil. He subsequently dismantled the cart and in 1875 produced a more satisfactory machine . In 1883 he was awarded a patent for a low voltage magneto, which was used in all his subsequent engines, including those that powered German Navy Torpedo boats
