#### ANNUAL BAZAAR BRINGS A CROWD

The Roma Anglican church held its yearly bazaar in September and the Club was there to display their vehicles. The Roma and District Aeromodelling Club also sat in the display as a few RHMC members are part of the Aeromodelling club as well. The members enjoyed a really social atmosphere taking in the food and local Choir featuring our President Karen. Local market stalls and a petting zoo were also on show. It's also a good opportunity to check out the large stained glass windows of the Church and its other historical features.











#### **St Paul's Church History Facts**

- 1. The first Anglican church in Roma was constructed from wood and opened on 17th October 1875, costing 1,200 pounds. This building, which seated about 200 parishioners, outgrew its congregation around 1910. The present church was built between 1913 and 1915, but due to financial problems the bell tower and the plastering of the arches and pillars were not completed until the 1960's.
- 2. Approximately 16,000 concrete blocks, made with two block making machines imported from the USA, form the construction of the building. One of these machines could make 100 blocks a day, and is on display.
- 3. The oldest windows date back to 1876, and the latest 2006. Ten windows were removed from the first church with three of these shipped out from England. The other 26 stained glass and 11 leadlight windows have been designed and constructed in Australia.
- 4. The tiles on the roof are from France. They landed into Brisbane Port in late 1890 and are called Marseille tiles, with a symbol of a lion on the back.
- 5. The magnificent timbers in the roof are Oregon and Hoop Pine, and the floor is made from Crows Ash and Huon Pine. The majority of the pews are constructed from Queensland Silky Oak.
- 6. The High Altar and Pulpit were constructed in Little Roma Street Brisbane. The Sandstone is of a fine grain buff and was sourced from a quarry at Ravensfield near Maitland NSW.
- 7. The Lectern was purchased from England in 1888 and is solid brass. It was in the first church.
- 8. The Font was also in the first church.
- 9. The Pipe Organ was installed in 1928 by Whitehouse Brothers, Brisbane at a cost of 1,288 pounds and has 567 pipes.
- 10. A Carillon was installed in 1955 and on a clear morning can be heard for 10 kilometer's (6 miles).






