SKODA

are celebrating their 125 Years Anniversary and some of their vehicles are featured on the cover of this month's magazine.

Skoda are one of the world's oldest automotive brands.



Václav Laurin & Václav Klement started their own business in Mladá Boleslav in 1895. In 1899 the Laurin & Klement factory became the first motorcycle manufacturer in the Austro-Hungarian Empire. As early as 1902, the brand fitted a motorcycle with a V-twin engine, a world first. Their motorcycles triumphed for their dynamics and reliability.

In 1905 the first international motorcycle road race took place at Dourdan, France. There was a disagreement with the organizers over regulations limiting the number of entrants. Vaclav Vondrich (known as the Travelling Smith) finished the famous Dourdan race, nine minutes ahead of the silver medallist. He drove the 693 ccm two-cylinder factory special.

In 1907, Laurin & Klement became one of the first carmakers in the world to produce an eight-cylinder engine. In 1925 L&K merged with the engineering company Skoda. The last L&K model was also the first Skoda.

L&K/Skoda 110 1925-1929 had both companies' logos on its radiator.

The model was popular and was available in a whole series of modifications, including soft-top and hard-top versions.

Several variants were also produced, sedan, phaeton, limousine, roadster, coupe, combined, lorry and ambulance.



The Skoda 860 1929-1933 demonstrates the high level of engineering competence that the Czech automaker had achieved by the pre-war period. Passenger cars with eight-cylinder in-line engines were popular in the first half of the 20th century and were especially appreciated for their smoothness. To reduce the vibrations in the engine, the engineers utilized a nine-bearing crankshaft and a Lanchester vibration damper. The flexibility of the 4-stroke petrol engine with 3,880 cc displacement is still impressive today: The 5.5-metre-long vehicle can accelerate from walking pace in its third and highest gear, with a top speed of 110 km/h. The brake system with a vacuum brake booster is also extraordinary for its time.

Skoda Rapid 1935-1938

RAPID was produced between 1935 and 1938. It was a very popular car with a 1.4 litre SV engine and produced as a sedan, sedan-convertible, tudor, convertible or van. The CABRIO DELUXE was the most luxurious RAPID, with chrome details and was produced until 1947.



The **Skoda 110R Coupe 1970-1980** The 110R coupe, a two-door sports version of the popular 110 four-door saloon, was the top of the Skoda range. The coupe used an 1107 cc four-cylinder engine that produced 52 bhp at 4650 rpm and 64lb ft at 3500 rpm. It succeeded the sporty Skoda 1000 MBX/1100 MBX.



The 110R used the same mechanical components as the Skoda 100/110 sedans plus an uprated 62 bhp (46 kW) 1,107cc version of Skoda's 720-type OHC four. This gave the car a top speed of 90 mph and enabled it to accelerate to 50 mph from rest in 13.5 secs. One of the most economical in its class, fuel consumption of over 33 mpg was possible.

Skoda 130RS - The 110 R was in 1975 the basis for another motor-sports legend. The Skoda 130 RS performances on rally courses and circuits earned it the nickname "the Porsche of the east". Its 1300-litre engine delivered 140-183 horsepower and top speeds of up to 220 km/h. It has a number of victories including the double at the Monte-Carlo '77.



Skoda 110 Super Sport "Ferat" - 1971-1981

Skoda's most futuristic car with an aerodynamic body made of fiberglass was first introduced in 1972 at the Motor Show in Brussels.

It is the first and only SKODA car with a door that tilts up with the windscreen and roof. Despite the interest of the public, it did not get into serial production. Thanks to its futuristic appearance, 10 years later the car was modified and played in several Czechoslovak films.
